TONIGHT: The Curve open the 2017 season against the Harrisburg Senators for the third consecutive season. Last season, the Curve went 76-64 and picked up the E.L. West Wild Card, beating out the Senators by a half-game. The final postseason spot came down to the wire on the last day of the regular season, with the Curve needing a win at Richmond in extra innings to hold off a late-season charge by the Senators. Altoona went on to fall in the ELDS in four games to the eventual-league-champion Akron RubberDucks. The two teams will attempt to kick off the season last night's originally-scheduled opener was postponed for rain.

FAMILIAR OPENING FOE: This year marks the sixth season and the third consecutive year in which the Curve open against the Senators. The Curve are 4-1 on Opening Day against the Senators, including a 10-6 loss in Altoona last year. The only time the Curve have opened up the season on City Island came in 2015, a 1-0 win.

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Alex McRae takes the hill on Opening Day for the Curve. He will be his second Opening Day start. He took the mound in Bradenton's first game last year against Fort Myers and tossed five scoreless innings while picking up a win. Last season he joined the Curve in late-June after making 12 starts in the Florida State League. After going 2-4 with a 10.25 ERA in his first six starts with Altoona, McRae went 6-2 with a 2.47 ERA (17 ER/62.0 IP) over his last ten outings (nine starts) from July 14-September 1. A native of Milwaukee, McRae is in his fourth professional season after being drafted by the Pirates in the tenth round out of Jacksonville University in 2014, where he played first and third base along with pitching. *For more on McRae, see page two.*

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Jaron Long gets the season-opening start for the Senators. 2017 marks his fourth consecutive season in the Eastern League. Originally a member of the Yankees organization, Long pitched for the Trenton Thunder during his first full professional season in 2014, going 7-2 with a 2.35 ERA in 11 outings (ten starts). He pitched again for Trenton in 2015 and split time in Triple-A before being released by the Yankees prior to the 2016 season. The Nationals signed him on April 22, 2016 and he split time last season between Harrisburg and Triple-A Syracuse. Long was 3-3 with a 2.37 ERA over 10 starts with the Senators last year.

OPENING DAY NOTES: The Curve are 7-11 all-time in season openers over their first 18 seasons and just 1-8 when opening on the road. The Curve are 5-11 on Opening Day against teams from their own division and 4-5 against National League affiliates. An Altoona starting pitcher has not earned a win on Opening Day since 2010 when Mike Crotta earned a victory against the Senators.

ROSTER: The 2017 Curve roster has 10 players that have worn an Altoona uniform prior to this season. 14 will be playing at the Double-A level for the first time in their careers. There are 13 pitchers and 12 position players on the Curve roster. 24 of the 25 players were originally signed or drafted by the Pirates, with the lone exception being catcher Zane Chavez. 23 players have played with only the Pirates organization in their professional careers (RHP Buddy Borden spent time in the Tampa Bay organization).

FAMILIAR FACES: The ten players who were with the Curve last year include pitchers Montana DuRapau, John Kuchno, Jared Lakind, Alex McRae, Miguel Rosario and Brandon Waddell, catcher Tomas Morales, infielders Edwin Espinal and Kevin Newman, as well as outfielder Elvis Escobar. DuRapau and Kuchno also spent time on the Altoona roster in 2015. Kuchno and Morales are the only two players on the team with an experience above the Double-A level.

A NEW SKIPPER: For the third consecutive season, the Curve will led by a brand new manager in 2017. Indiana, Pa. native Michael Ryan takes over as the manager for the Curve this year after leading the A-Adv. Bradenton Marauders to a championship in the Florida State League last season. Ryan was a coach with the Curve in 2012 before spending the next two years managing the West Virginia Power in the South Atlantic League. He moved up to Bradenton in 2015 for the first of his two seasons there. Ryan was drafted by the Minnesota Twins out of Indiana Area High School in 1996 and he went on to play in 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors with the Twins from 2002-05 and the Los Angeles Angels in 2010. The last two managers, Tom Prince and Joey Cora, are now members of the Pirates' major league coaching staff.

HELLO, NEWMAN: Shortstop Kevin Newman is the top-ranked prospect on this year's Curve roster, rated at No. 4 in the Pirates organization by both MLB.com and Baseball America. He made his Double-A debut with the Curve last season and led the Pirates' organization with a .320 overall batting average in his first full professional season, including a .288 mark with the Curve in 61 games. Newman was selected in the first round of the 2015 MLB Draft out of the University of Arizona.

DU-RAP IT UP: Altoona closer Montana DuRapau finished second in the Eastern League with 22 saves last year, fourth-most in Curve history. It was tied for the second-most for a Curve pitcher in a season since 2007, behind only 24 by Noah Krol in 2011. He finished first with 43 games finished and fourth with 50 appearances.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve roster currently features four of MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates Prospects: Kevin Newman (4), Yeudy Garcia (13), Brandon Waddell (17) and Kevin Kramer (21). The same four players are also ranked in Baseball America's Top 30 Pittsburgh prospects list: Newman (4), Garcia (16), Waddell (17) and Kramer (21). B.A. also named Newman as the organization's "Best Hitter for Average" and Waddell as having the "Best Changeup."

Ryan returns to Altoona after serving as a coach for the Curve in 2012. He spent the past four seasons as a manager in the Pirates organization, leading the Bradenton Marauders the last two years and the West Virginia Power the two before that. He steered Bradenton to a 70-66 record in 2016, including winning the Florida State League championship. Ryan was drafted in the fifth round by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, and he went on to play 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors.

Hickerson joins the Altoona staff in 2017 for his first year in the Pirates' organization.
