**LAST NIGHT:** A six-run lead evaporated as the Curve lost to the RubberDucks, 7-6. Bobby Bradley hit a go-ahead, two-run homer for Akron in the top of the ninth inning. Altoona starting pitcher Dario Agrazal took a no-hitter through six innings, but Akron stormed back against the Curve bullpen with four runs in the seventh and one in the eighth to close within a run. The Curve started the scoring in the first inning after loading the bases with three consecutive fielding errors by the Akron infield. Bryan Reynolds brought home the first run with a sac fly. Cole Tucker plated a run with an infield bunt single in the second. The Curve scored four runs in the fourth to open the lead to 6-0. Logan Hill hit a two-run single and Ke'Bryan Hayes added another two-run single. Christian Kelley, Tucker, Stephen Alemais and Hill each had two-hit games for the Curve.

**TONIGHT:** The 20th Season of Altoona Curve Baseball, presented by Stuckey Subaru, continues at Peoples Natural Gas Field as the Curve face the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians in the third of a four-game series.

**THE CURVE:** Heading into the 2018 season, the Curve are the only team in the Eastern League who have qualified for the postseason in each of the last three years. After back-to-back wild card berths, Altoona was the Western Division's top seed heading into the postseason in 2017. With four of the top-six MLB.com Pirates prospects and nine of the top-30, the Curve have the most decorated prospect roster of Pittsburgh's minor league affiliates to start the year. Top-ranked prospect Mitch Keller returns after dominating in the E.L. postseason last season. Notable Curve newcomers include 2017 Florida State League All-Stars Dario Agrazal, Jake Brentz, Ke'Bryan Hayes, Logan Hill, Christian Kelley and Cole Tucker. Bryan Reynolds, part of the package of players sent to the Pirates in the Andrew McCutchen trade on January 15, joins Altoona this season. Elvis Escobar, who was a standout offensive performer in last year's E.L. postseason, returns for a third year with the Curve, as well as 2017 E.L. All-Star Wyatt Mathisen.

**THE RUBBERDUCKS:** After falling out of the playoff race late in the 2017 campaign, Akron returns to action in 2018. The RubberDucks hold the most titles in the Eastern League since the Curve joined in 1999 with five (2003, 2005, 2009, 2012 and 2016). The Ducks return first baseman Bobby Bradley, ranked as the No. 3 Cleveland prospect by MLB.com heading into the season. He finished second in the E.L. last season with 89 RBIs while belting 23 homers. Fifth-ranked Indians prospect Willi Castro, a shortstop, joins Akron after an All-Star campaign last season in the Carolina League with Lynchburg.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Left-hander **Brandon Waddell** takes the mound for his 2018 debut in his third season with the Curve. Last year, Waddell began the season 0-2 with a 4.55 ERA over his first eight starts prior to the All-Star Break, but hit the disabled list twice, including for a long stretch from June 8 through July 31 with a left forearm strain. When he returned, he posted a 3-1 record with a 2.82 ERA in his final seven regular-season starts. The Houston native also pitched game one of the ELCS at Trenton on September 12, throwing six scoreless innings in a 2-1 Curve win, which extended his career postseason scoreless streak to 19.0 innings in three starts. Waddell pitched the University of Virginia to a College World Series title in 2015, and he was the winning pitcher in their national championship clincher against Vanderbilt. He is ranked as the Pirates' No. 19 prospect by *Baseball America* and No. 29 by MLB.com. He went 0-1 with a 1.23 ERA in three starts against Akron last year.

**FOR AKRON:** Right-hander **Michael Peoples** takes the mound to begin his third season with Akron. Last year, the Texas native went 2-5 with a 5.58 ERA at Double-A and 1-4 with a 7.14 REA in eight Triple-A appearances with Columbus. A 14th-round draft pick out of Western Oklahoma State College in 2012, Peoples went 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA in two starts against Altoona in 2017.

**HAMMERIN' HILL:** After finishing second in the Pirates' system with 18 total homers between Bradenton and Altoona (despite missing the last weeks of the season with a left hand fracture), **Logan Hill** clubbed the first Curve homer of the season on Thursday night. His blast broke a 3-3 tie and capped a six-run eighth inning for Altoona. At the time of his promotion to Altoona last year, Hill led the Florida State League with 16 homers in just 71 games. Dating back to last year, Hill is currently riding a 19-game on-base streak, which is the second longest in the Eastern League. This year, he is tied for the Eastern League lead with five RBIs.

**COLE TRAIN:** Dating back the end of the 2017 regular season, Cole Tucker currently holds an 18-game on-base streak. In that span, the switch-hitter is batting .356 (26/73) with five doubles, two triples, two homers, 16 RBIs and 13 runs scored.

**RISP-ECT:** The Curve did not see a runner reach second base until the eighth inning in Thursday night's game, but finished the night a perfect 3-for-3 with runners in scoring position. On Friday, the team hit just 3-for-15 with runners in scoring position and left 13 on base in a one-run loss. In 2017, the Curve hit .262 with runners in scoring position.

**ROSTER:** The 2018 Curve roster has 14 players who have worn an Altoona uniform prior to this season. 11 will be playing at the Double-A level for the first time. There are 13 pitchers and 12 position players on the roster. 21 of the 25 players were originally signed or drafted by the Pirates.

**RYAN RETURNS:** Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** returns for a second season leading the Curve in 2018. Last season, he picked up his second straight championship as a manager after winning the Florida State League title in 2016 with the Bradenton Marauders. He served as a coach with the Curve in 2012 and went on to manager the Single-A West Virginia Power the following two years. He managed Bradenton from 2015-16. As a player, Ryan was drafted by the Minnesota Twins out of Indiana Area High School in 1996 and went on to play 15 professional seasons, including four in the majors with the Twins from 2002-05 and one with the Angels in 2010. He is joined on his staff by second-year pitching coach **Bryan Hickerson**, new hitting coach **Keoni De Renne** and coach **Stephen Morales**.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve roster features nine of MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Mitch Keller** (1), **Ke'Bryan Hayes** (4), **Cole Tucker** (5), **Bryan Reynolds** (6), **Taylor Hearn** (11), **Will Craig** (18), **Stephen Alemais** (20), **Jason Martin** (22) and **Brandon Waddell** (29). The roster also features eight of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects: Keller (1), Hayes (4), Tucker (6), Hearn (9), Waddell (19), Craig (24), Alemais (28) and **Dario Agrazal** (30). Reynolds was ranked by B.A. as the Giants' No. 5 prospect prior to being traded to Pittsburgh. B.A. also rated Tucker as "Fastest Baserunner," Keller as having the "Best Fastball," Best Curveball" and "Best Control," Waddell as having the "Best Changeup," **Christian Kelley** as the "Best Defensive Catcher," and Hayes as "Best Defensive Infielder." Keller is ranked by B.A. as the No. 12 prospect in baseball and the No. 15 overall prospect by MLB.com, as well as MLB.com's No. 5 overall RHP.
