YESTERDAY: The Curve clinched a regular-season series win in Trenton for the first time since 2014 with a 9-7 win. Logan Hill gave the Curve a 3-2 lead with a two-run homer in the fourth inning and Ke'Bryan Hayes brought in a run with a double later in the inning. In the fifth, Bryan Reynolds scored on a wild pitch and Logan Hill followed with a two-run double. Cole Tucker capped the scoring for the inning with a sac fly to open an 8-2 lead. In the ninth, Tucker singled home a run to extend the lead to 9-2. Trenton scored five runs in the bottom of the ninth and had runners on second and third before Matt Eckelman closed out the game. Altoona starter Eduardo Vera allowed two runs over six innings for his sixth win. Trenton starter Trevor Stephan allowed a career-high seven runs.

TODAY: The 20th Season of Altoona Curve Baseball, presented by Stuckey Subaru, continues as the Curve face the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers, in the first of a four-game, three-day series. This series marks the final meetings between the Curve and SeaWolves this season. The Curve swept a rain-shortened, two-game series in Erie from April 13-15, split two games in another rain-shortened set at home from April 23-25, split four games from May 3-5 with the finale postponed due to rain in Altoona, dropped two of three in Erie from June 22-24 and won three of five in Erie from July 12-15. In five previous series, the Curve have won two, lost one and split two. Four games between the two teams have been postponed due to rain this season.

THE CURVE: The Curve have won ten of their last 16 games since July 23. In those 16 games, the Curve are hitting .250 (130/520) with 12 homers, averaging 5.0 runs per game (80 total runs). The pitching staff has a 3.90 ERA (60 ER/138.1 IP) over the last 16 games. Over the last nine series played, the Curve have won six, lost two and split one. The Curve are playing their third of five straight series against American League-affiliated opponents. The Curve are ten games over .500 for the second time this season, also reaching that mark on Tuesday, which had previous not been reached since the 2016 season. The Curve have been in second place in the Western Division since July 7 and are back within three games of first-place Akron for the first time since July 2.

THE SEAWOLVES: The SeaWolves won two of three games at home over Portland in their most recent series, outscoring the Sea Dogs, 32-14. They had lost each of their previous three sets (3 of 4 vs. AKR, 2 of 3 @ POR, 2 of 3 @ NH). Over their eight games this month, the SeaWolves are hitting .300, best in the Eastern League, but have posted a 5.70 ERA, which is the second-highest in the league. Erie leads the league this year with 10 shutout wins. The current Erie roster includes eight of MLB.com's Top 30 Detroit Tigers prospects: Alex Faedo (No. 4), Beau Burrows (No. 5), Daz Cameron (No. 8), Willi Castro (No. 10), Jake Rogers (No. 11), Isaac Paredes (No. 12), Sergio Alcantara (No. 19) and Sandy Baez (No. 24).

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander James Marvel takes the mound for his Double-A debut. He made 22 appearances (21 starts) with A-Adv. Bradenton this year, going 9-6 with a 3.68 ERA. Over his last eight starts since June 27, Marvel went 3-1 with a 2.36 ERA (14 ER/53.1 IP). At the time of his promotion, Marvel was ranked seventh in the Florida State League with a 3.68 ERA, tied for second with 21 starts, tied for first with two complete games, first with 134.1 innings pitched, fourth with a 1.21 WHIP and first with a 2.02 BB/9 IP ratio. Marvel was drafted in the 36th round in 2015 out of Duke. Marvel is the 18th different starting pitcher for Altoona this year, tied for the third-most in a season in team history (2012) behind 2001 (21) and 2013 (22).

FOR ERIE: Right-hander A.J. Ladwig makes his sixth start of the season for the SeaWolves and second against Altoona. He began the season with Triple-A Toledo, going 5-4 with a 6.39 ERA over 15 games before being demoted to Erie in July. Ladwig made his first appearance of the year with the SeaWolves on July 13 and allowed four earned runs over 5.1 innings against the Curve. In his four starts since then, Ladwig has gone 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA (4 ER/23.1 IP). Drafted by the Tigers out of Wichita State in the 11th round in 2014, Ladwig is in his second season with the SeaWolves.

HOME COOKIN': Over their last 33 home games since May 19, the Curve have gone 22-11. The pitching staff has combined to post a 3.33 ERA (109 ER/295.0 IP) over the last 33 games at PNG Field. The Altoona offense has combined to hit .265 (278/1048) over the last 33 games at home. The Curve played eight straight home series that resulted in a win or split (five series wins, three series splits) before losing two-of-three to the Bowie Baysox on July 16-18, a stretch that lasted from May 7-9 to July 16-18. Two of three total home series losses have been to Bowie.

EAST VS. WEST: The Curve have gone 23-14 against the Eastern Division this season and 38-37 against the West. For the season, the Curve have hit .283 (354/1252) and scored 5.5 runs per game (202 runs/37 games) against Eastern Division teams, compared to .237 (562/2370) and 3.9 runs per game (290 total runs/79 games) against the West. Altoona has a 4.31 ERA (155 ER/323.1 IP) against the Eastern Division and a 3.74 ERA (267/642.1 IP) against the Western Division.

YOUNG HAYES: Over his last 60 games since May 19, Ke'Bryan Hayes is batting .316 (72/228), third-best in the league, with 21 doubles, six homers and 27 RBIs while working 33 walks. His .973 fielding percentage is the best among Eastern League third basemen this season. Hayes hit his seventh homer on Sunday, a new career-best total for a single season. He also has career-high totals in doubles (28), extra-base hits (41) and walks (46) while sitting one triple short of matching his career-best of seven from 2017 with A-Adv. Bradenton. He is currently on a ten-game hitting streak, his longest of the season, during which he has hit .293 (12/41) with two homers and seven RBIs.

ALEMAIS-ING: Over his last 27 games since July 7, Stephen Alemais is batting .322 (29/90) with 10 RBIs and has drawn 14 walks. In 68 games since May 19, Alemais is batting .307 (67/218), fifth in the league, with 12 doubles, one triple, one homer, 29 walks, 26 RBIs and 11 stolen bases. He opened the season with a .310 batting average over his first 15 games through April 23, but batted just .102 (6/59) over his next 18 games from April 25-May 18.

WILL POWER: 2016 first-round draft pick Will Craig continues to pace the Pirates organization in RBIs, totaling 91 on the season. He is on pace to drive in 112 runs this season, which would break the franchise record set by Adam Hyzdu with 106 RBIs in 2000. The RBI total is the second-most in franchise history for a single season, surpassing Jose Bautista (90 - 2005) with two RBIs on Tuesday night. His 91 RBIs this season rank first in the Eastern League and his 31 since the all-star break leads all hitters on the circuit. He also leads the Pirates organization with 18 home runs, a career high. Over his last 21 games since July 18, Craig is batting .321 (25/78) with five homers and 24 RBIs. He also has the most RBIs in a season by a Pirates minor leaguer since Andrew Lambo drove in 99 in 2013 and second-most since 2010. His RBI total is also tied for the fourth-most in the E.L. since 2014 behind Dylan Cozens (125 - 2016), Rhys Hoskins (116 - 2016) and Steven Moya (105 - 2014).

MOVING ON AND GETTING OVER: After swiping 47 bases last year between Bradenton and Altoona, Cole Tucker did not pick up his first stolen base this season until May 22, going 0-for-5 in attempts. Since then, he has gone 28-for-34 in stolen base attempts. He is tied for the league lead in steals with 28 and is second behind Jared Oliva (A-Adv. Bradenton) for the most in the Pirates system. Tucker was rated by Baseball America as the "Fastest Baserunner" in the Pirates organization heading into the 2018 season. Over a seven-game stretch from July 31-August 8, Tucker went 2-for-28 (.071) at the plate with seven walks, but recovered with a 3-for-4 night on Thursday.

REYNOLDS KEEPS ROLLIN': Over 20 games since July 19, Bryan Reynolds has ten multi-hit games while batting .338 (27/80) with four homers, three doubles, one triple and 14 RBIs. He has scored 23 runs since the all-star break, tied with Cole Tucker (23 runs) among Eastern League hitters. Reynolds missed seven weeks from April 10 to May 29 with a hamate fracture and hit .125 (3/24) through his first six games off the DL between May 29 to June 6. Reynolds was acquired by the Pirates in January along with RHP Kyle Crick for OF Andrew McCutchen.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve roster features seven of MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects: Ke'Bryan Hayes (2), Cole Tucker (6), Bryan Reynolds (9), Luis Escobar (12), Will Craig (17), Stephen Alemais (19) and Dario Agrazal (28). The roster also features seven of Baseball America's Top 30 Pirates prospects: Hayes (4), Tucker (6), Escobar (7), Craig (24), Yeudy Garcia (26), Alemais (28) and Agrazal (30). Reynolds was ranked by B.A. as the Giants' No. 5 prospect prior to being traded to Pittsburgh. B.A. also rated Tucker as "Fastest Baserunner," Christian Kelley as the "Best Defensive Catcher," and Hayes as "Best Defensive Infielder." Hayes is ranked by MLB.com as the No. 54 overall prospect and the No. 5 third base prospect. The Curve roster has featured 14 of MLB.com's Top 30 prospects throughout the season.

Ryan returns to Altoona after leading the Curve to the Eastern League title in 2017. He also served as a coach for the Curve in 2012. He is in his sixth season as a manager in the Pirates organization, leading the Bradenton Marauders from 2015-16 and the West Virginia Power from 2014-15. He steered Bradenton to a 70-66 record in 2016, including winning the Florida State League championship. Ryan was drafted in the fifth round by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, and he went on to play 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors.

Hickerson returns to the Altoona staff after overseeing strong group of Curve pitchers in 2017 for his first year in the Pirates organization. He spent the previous 18 years working in ministry, mostly in the context of professional baseball and the military. A left-handed pitcher as a player, Hickerson was drafted by the Twins in the seventh round in 1986. He played a total of five major league seasons with the Giants, Cubs and Rockies. After his playing days, Hickerson served as a pitching coach in the Giants organization in 1997 & 1998.

De Renne joins the Curve in 2018 for his sixth season overall working in the Pittsburgh minor league system and his fifth as a hitting coach. He managed the Pirates' affiliate in the Dominican Summer League in 2013 to a 46-26 record. He joined Michael Ryan's staff as the hitting coach for the West Virginia Power from 2014-15 and spent each of the last three seasons with the Bradenton Marauders. As a player, De Renne was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the 12th round in 2000 out of the University of Arizona and played 11 professional seasons.

Morales joins the Curve for his first season working in the Pirates organization. He spent the last five seasons as a coach with the Indios de Mayaguez of the Liga de Béisbol Profesional Roberto Clemente (Roberto Clemente Professional Baseball League) in Puerto Rico, working mostly with catchers, including major leaguers Martin Maldonado, Roberto Perez, Christian Vazquez, Rafael Lopez and Rene Rivera. As a player, Morales was drafted in the 23rd round in 1996 by the Florida Marlins and played 15 total professional seasons.

In his seventh season as a member of the Pittsburgh organization, Ahrens returns to Altoona for a second season in 2018. He spent two years in Bradenton from 2015-16, where he was named Florida State League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2016. He spent each of the last five seasons on the same staff as manager Michael Ryan. Ahrens received a bachelor's degree in athletic training from Carroll University in 2011, and a master's degree in kinesiology from Fresno Pacific University in 2016.

Schlesinger returns to the Curve for his second season, after making stops at Jamestown, West Virginia and Bradenton within the Pittsburgh system. Prior to joining the Pirates, he served as the strength and conditioning graduate assistant at Duquesne University from 2012-2014. Schlesinger graduated from Toledo with a degree in exercise science in 2011 and completed his master's degree of science in sports leadership at Duquesne in 2014.
