YESTERDAY: The Curve beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 8-2, in the finale of a three-game series at Hadlock Field. The Curve scored the game's first run after a pair of errors by Portland in the second inning. Later in the frame, Arden Pabst cracked a three-run homer, his second with the Curve, to open a 4-0 lead. Portland scored twice in the fourth to pull within two runs, by Alfredo Reyes scored on a passed ball in the fifth to extend the lead back to 5-2. Cole Tucker added a two-run double in the sixth inning and Pabst hit an RBI single in the seventh to cap the scoring. Altoona starter Dario Agrazal worked six innings and allowed two runs. Geoff Hartlieb, Scooter Hightower and Matt Eckelman each threw one scoreless innings.

TODAY: The 20th Season of Altoona Curve Baseball, presented by Stuckey Subaru, continues as the Curve face the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets in the opener of a two-game series at NYSEG Stadium. This game is the seventh of an eight-game, three-city road trip, the longest of the season for the Curve, all against Eastern Division opponents. It also marks the first of three straight series against National League-affiliated series after five consecutive sets against American League affiliates.

THE CURVE: The Curve have won nine of their last 14 games since August 5. In that stretch, the Altoona offense has combined to hit .257 (119/464) and averaging 4.5 runs per game (63 total runs). The pitching staff has combined for a 2.62 ERA (36 ER/123.2 IP). Over the last 12 series played, the Curve have won eight, lost two and split two. They have also won four of the last five series, with a four-game split against Erie in the middle. The Curve have been in second place in the Western Division since July 7. In the Curve's six losses in the month of August, they have lost by one run five times, two runs once and three runs once. Since falling a game under .500 and back to fourth in the division on June 5, the Curve have gone 41-28. With Wednesday's win, the Curve improved to 12 games over .500 for the first time since the end of the 2016 season. The team was last at least 13 games over .500 on September 1, 2016 (75-61).

THE RUMBLE PONIES: Heading into the series, Binghamton has won four straight games and five of the last six. The Rumble Ponies swept a three-game series against Reading over the weekend. The Rumble Ponies are on their longest winning streak since May 11-15 when they won five straight games. Binghamton has a 2.30 ERA (11 ER/43.0 IP) over the last five games, but is batting just .219 (32/146) in that stretch. The Rumble Ponies' roster includes seven of MLB.com's Top-30 New York Mets prospects: No. 1 Andres Gimenez, No. 4 Justin Dunn, No. 5 Franklyn Kilome, No. 12 Tomas Nido, No. 24 Will Toffey, No. 25 Stephen Nogosek and No. 28 Patrick Mazeika.

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander **James Marvel** takes the mound for his third Double-A start. He has combined to allow three runs over his first two starts with the Curve, and he picked up his first Double-A win in his most recent outing on Wednesday in New Hampshire. Over his last ten total starts since June 27 between Altoona and Bradenton, Marvel has gone 4-2 with a 2.31 ERA (17 ER/66.1 IP). He made 22 appearances (21 starts) with A-Adv. Bradenton this year, going 9-6 with a 3.68 ERA. At the time of his promotion, Marvel was ranked seventh in the Florida State League with a 3.68 ERA, tied for second with 21 starts, tied for first with two complete games, first with 134.1 innings pitched, fourth with a 1.21 WHIP and first with a 2.02 BB/9 IP ratio. Marvel was drafted in the 36th round in 2015 out of Duke. **For more on Marvel, see page two.**

FOR BINGHAMTON: Left-hander **Matt Gage** makes his third start with the Rumble Ponies. He has won each of his first two outings as a member of the Mets organization heading into tonight's outing. He began the season as a member of the Giants organization with Richmond and went 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA over four starts. He was promoted to Triple-A on May 1 and made 11 appearances (10 starts) with Sacramento, going 4-7 with a 6.45 ERA before being released on July 13. After making one start with the independent Sugar Land Skeeters, Gage signed with the Mets on August 4. Gage was originally drafted by San Francisco in the 10th round in 2014 out of Siena.

BEATING THE EAST: The Curve have gone 27-16 against the Eastern Division this season and 40-39 against the West. For the season, the Curve have hit .274 (397/1450) and scored 5.4 runs per game (232 runs/43 games) against Eastern Division teams, compared to .240 (601/2500) and 3.7 runs per game (304 total runs/83 games) against the West. Altoona has a 4.14 ERA (169 ER/367.0 IP) against the Eastern Division and a 3.65 ERA (278 ER/685.1 IP) against the West.

YOUNG HAYES: Over his last 67 games since May 19, **Ke'Bryan Hayes** is batting .303 (80/264), fifth-best in the league, with 23 doubles, four triples, six homers and 30 RBIs while working 38 walks. Has his career-high totals in home runs (7), doubles (30), extra-base hits (43) and walks (46) while sitting one triple short of matching his career-best of seven from 2017 with A-Adv. Bradenton. Hayes saw his 16-game hitting streak snapped on Thursday, his longest of the season and the longest active streak in the league at the time. The streak is tied for the eighth-longest in franchise history with Starling Marte (2011) and Gorkys Hernandez (2010). Since the streak was snapped, Hayes is 0-for-14 over the last four games.

WILL POWER: 2016 first-round draft pick **Will Craig** continues to pace the Pirates organization in RBIs, totaling 94 on the season. He is on pace to drive in 106 runs this season, which would tie the franchise record set by Adam Hyzdu with 106 RBIs in 2000. The RBI total is the second-most in franchise history for a single season, surpassing Jose Bautista (90 - 2005). His 94 RBIs this season rank first in the Eastern League. He also leads the Pirates organization with 19 home runs, a career high. Over his last 31 games since July 18, Craig is batting .288 (34/118) with six homers and 27 RBIs. He also has the most RBIs in a season by a Pirates minor leaguer since Andrew Lambo drove in 99 in 2013. His RBI total is the fourth-highest in the E.L. since 2014 behind Dylan Cozens (125 - 2016), Rhys Hoskins (116 - 2016) and Steven Moya (105 - 2014).

MOVING ON AND GETTING OVER: After swiping 47 bases last year between Bradenton and Altoona, **Cole Tucker** did not pick up his first stolen base this season until May 22, going 0-for-5 in attempts. Since then, he has gone 30-for-37 in stolen base attempts. He is first in the league in steals with 30 and is second in the Pirates system behind Alfredo Reyes. Tucker was rated by Baseball America as the "Fastest Baserunner" in the Pirates organization heading into the 2018 season.

REYNOLDS KEEPS ROLLIN': Over 30 games since July 19, **Bryan Reynolds** has 12 multi-hit games while batting .322 (38/118) with five homers, four doubles, one triple and 19 RBIs. His nine-game hitting streak was snapped on Wednesday night, during which he hit .368 (14/38). Reynolds missed seven weeks from April 10 to May 29 with a hamate fracture. He was acquired by the Pirates in January along with RHP Kyle Crick for OF Andrew McCutchen.

A LITTLE RELIEF: Over his last 11 outings since July 20, reliever **Matt Eckelman** has worked 11.0 innings without allowing an earned run, lowering his ERA from 4.15 to 11.93. He has converted five straight save chances since August 3. In 10 appearances since July 19, **Geoff Hartlieb** has posted a 0.66 ERA (1 ER/13.2 IP). **Bret Helton** has compiled a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11 IP) in six appearances since July 25. Over his last eight relief outings since July 28, **Tate Sconeaux** has a 3.00 ERA (3 ER/9.0 IP) with two saves. **Logan Sendelbach** has a 1.38 ERA (5 ER/32.2 IP) over his last 16 outings since June 14.

D-D-DEFENSE: The Curve currently lead the Eastern League with a .984 fielding percentage, which would set the record for the best in franchise history (.980 - 2016 & '17). The team has committed 69 errors and is on pace for 78 on the season, which would be the fewest in team history (105 - 2016, '17). The .976 fielding percentage by **Ke'Bryan Hayes** would be the best in team history by a third baseman (.962 - Jason Bowers, 2008) and the best in the Eastern League by a third baseman since at least 1959. Will Craig has the best fielding percentage of all first basemen in the league (.994) and Cole Tucker has the top fielding percentage at shortstop (.972).

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve roster features seven of MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Ke'Bryan Hayes** (2), **Cole Tucker** (5), **Bryan Reynolds** (8), **Luis Escobar** (11), **Will Craig** (16), **Stephen Alemais** (18) and **Dario Agrazal** (26). The roster also features seven of Baseball America's Top 30 Pirates prospects: Hayes (4), Tucker (6), Escobar (7), Craig (24), **Yeudy Garcia** (26), Alemais (28) and Agrazal (30). Reynolds was ranked by B.A. as the Giants' No. 5 prospect prior to being traded to Pittsburgh. B.A. also rated Tucker as "Fastest Baserunner," **Christian Kelley** as the "Best Defensive Catcher," and Hayes as "Best Defensive Infielder." Hayes is ranked by MLB.com as the No. 54 overall prospect and the No. 5 third base prospect. The Curve roster has featured 14 of MLB.com's Top 30 prospects throughout the season.
