**TONIGHT:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball begins at Canal Park in Akron, Ohio as the Curve begin their defense of back-to-back Western Division championships against the Akron RubberDucks, the Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians.

**LAST SEASON:** The Curve finished 78-60 in the regular season with a league-best .565 winning percentage and won the Western Division by one game over Akron. The 2018 division crown was the fourth division title and the first back-to-back championships in club history. The Curve and RubberDucks squared off in the Western Division Series, with Akron claiming three-of-four to move on to the Eastern League Championship Series. In Game 1, a three-run third for Akron wiped out an early 1-0 Curve lead as the Ducks went on to win, 5-2. Game 2 was a pitchers duel that saw Curve starter **Eduardo Vera** toss eight innings of one-run ball against Akron starter Jake Paulson's seven one-run frames. Nellie Rodriguez clubbed a solo, walk-off homer to send the series to Altoona with Akron up, 2-0, in the series after a 2-1 win in the 10th inning. Akron jumped out to a 5-0 lead against **James Marvel** in Game 3 but the Curve stormed back with the help of a game-tying grand slam by Cole Tucker in the fifth inning. **Logan Hill** knocked in the go-ahead run during the eighth as the Curve held off elimination with an 8-5 victory. The RubberDucks ended the series the next day with a lopsided 9-0 win in Game 4.

**OPENING NIGHT NOTES:** Over the franchise's first 20 seasons, the Curve have gone 9-11 on Opening Day. Altoona seeks a third straight win on Opening Day after knocking off the RubberDucks last season, 6-5, and the Harrisburg Senators, 5-3, on April 7, 2017 at FNB Field. The last two Opening Day wins are the first back-to-back wins in the season opener in team history. Last season, the Curve rallied for six runs in the bottom of the eighth and held off a late Akron comeback in the ninth. After Stephen Alematis tied the game, 3-3, on his first Double-A hit, Logan Hill unloaded a three-run, go-ahead homer. When opening the season on the road, the club is 2-8 overall but have won their last two road season openers. *For more on Opening Day, see page 104-105 of the Curve Media Guide.*

**STARTING WITH AKRON:** The Curve open the season with Akron for the third time in franchise history and the second consecutive season in a rematch of the 2018 Western Division Series. Last year, the Curve and RubberDucks met at Peoples Natural Gas Field, the first time Akron has opened a season in Altoona. The other head-to-head contest on Opening Day for the two squads was at Canal Park on April 9, 2007 with the then-Aeros winning, 5-4.

**DOING THE SPLITS:** For the first time since the Curve joined the Eastern League in 1999, the Eastern League will play a split-season format beginning in 2019. Playoff berths will be awarded to the division champs in each half and will set the stage for the first round of the postseason. The last time the Eastern League played a split season was in 1982, which was the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

**THE CURVE:** Entering 2019, the Curve own the longest active streak for reaching the Eastern League postseason as the only club to make the playoffs in each of the last four seasons. During that span, the Curve own the best record in the Western Division (302-258) while only the only teams in the league with better records are Trenton (329-235) and Reading (305-254). Four consecutive playoff appearances is also tied for the longest streak in franchise history (2003-06).

**THE RUBBERDUCKS:** Akron returned to the playoffs in 2018 and reached the Eastern League Championship Series for the second time in the seasons after defeating the Curve, 3-1, in their best-of-five series last September. The RubberDucks were swept in three games by the New Hampshire Fisher Cats during the Eastern League Championship Series. Akron carries four of the Indians Top 30 prospects on their Opening Day roster including left-handed pitcher and Opening Day starter Sam Hentges (No. 10). Shortstop Ernie Clement (No. 15) and right-handed pitcher James Karinchak (No. 30) return to the team. Outfielder Daniel Johnson (No. 22) joined Cleveland's organization in an off-season trade from the Nationals after he spent the season with Harrisburg. Akron returns three 2018 Eastern League All-Stars in outfielders Andrew Calica and Connor Marabell along with right-handed pitcher Jake Paulson.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Right-hander James Marvel makes the second Opening Day start of his career. He last pitched a season-opener for the Single-A West Virginia Power in 2017 and had a no-decision despite five scoreless innings. Marvel reached Double-A in early August and won three of his five starts with Altoona. Born in San Francisco, Marvel was drafted by the Pirates in the sixth round in 2015 out of Duke University. *For more on Marvel, see page two.*

**FOR AKRON:** Left-hander Sam Hentges is set for his Double-A debut and second straight Opening Day start when he faces the Curve on Thursday. Hentges tossed four scoreless innings in the start for A-Adv. Lynchburg's season-opening win last year. A fourth-round pick by the Indians out of Mounds View High School in Arden Hills, Minn. in 2014, Hentges ranks as Cleveland's 10th-best prospect by MLB.com entering the 2018 season. He went 6-6 with a 3.27 ERA in 23 starts for the Hillcats in 2018 and led the Carolina League in strikeouts/9 IP (9.3). His ERA finished second among pitchers in the league.

**DEJA VU:** Of eight probable pitchers in the series, seven of the starting pitchers scheduled to pitch in the season-opening series took the hill in the 2018 Western Division Series. **Cam Vieaux** started Game 1 for the Curve against Kyle Dowdy, **Eduardo Vera** and Jake Paulson matched up in Game 2, Game 3 pitted **James Marvel** against Zach Plesac and **Dario Agrazal** started opposite Sean Brady in Game 4.

**RYAN'S REIGN:** Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** returns for a third season as Curve manager in 2019. Over the last two years, the Curve have gone 152-126 under Ryan's direction and won back-to-back Western Division titles for the first time in club history. Ryan's .547 winning percentage entering the 2019 season is second-best all-time among Curve managers behind Tony Beasley's .569 mark (161-122) during the 2004-05 seasons. His 152 wins rank fourth all-time in team history. Ryan joins elite company with Dale Sveum (2001-03) and Tim Liper (2006-08) as the only managers to hold the post for three seasons. Ryan's coaching career began in Altoona in 2012 before he went on to manage the Single-A West Virginia Power the following two seasons. He managed Bradenton from 2015-16 and won league championships in the Florida State League in 2016 in addition to the Eastern League in 2017. As a player, Ryan was drafted by the Minnesota Twins out of Indiana Area High School in 1996 and went on to play 15 professional seasons, including four in the majors with the Twins from 2002-05 and one with the Angels in 2010.

**NEW STAFF:** There are three new additions to Michael Ryan's coaching staff for 2019 will be pitching coach **Joel Hanrahan**, hitting coach **Jon Nunnally** and coach **Salvador Paniagua**. Hanrahan pitched seven seasons in the major leagues included four years with the Pittsburgh Pirates. He was a National League All-Star as the Bucs closer in 2011 and 2012. While Hanrahan was pitching for Pittsburgh, Nunnally was the hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians under manager Manny Acta in 2010-11. Nunnally's playing career lasted six years at the big-league level from 1995-2000 while he played 15 total seasons. Paniagua played for 13 years before he became a coach with the Pirates prior to the 2017 season. *For more on the Curve coaching staff, see page nine.*

**ROSTER:** Altoona's Opening Day roster included 14 players that spent time with the Curve in 2018 while 17 players have Double-A experience prior to the 2019 season. Five players (Dario Agrazal, Jake Brentz, Yeudy Garcia, Logan Hill and Tate Scioneaux) are on the roster to start the year for a second consecutive year. Seven members of the club will be playing at Double-A for the first time. There are 13 pitchers and 12 position players on the team. 19 of the 25 players were originally drafted or signed by the Pirates.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve roster features three of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Jared Oliva** (No. 19), **Gage Hinz** (No. 28) and **Dario Agrazal** (No. 29). Two of those players are featured on MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects list: Oliva (No. 12) and Agrazal (No. 29). Oliva was also ranked by B.A. as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system.
