**YESTERDAY:** For the second time in three games to begin the new season, the Curve pitching staff held the RubberDucks scoreless and improved to 3-0 for the first time since 2010 after a 2-0 victory. Cam Vieaux limited the 'Ducks to two runs over 4.2 innings and Beau Sulser earned the win in his Double-A debut with 2.1 hitless innings. Angel German tossed a scoreless eighth while Matt Eckelman locked down his first save of the season. Altoona scored first during the opening inning off Akron starter Sean Brady with three straight two-out hits, including an RBI hit by Logan Hill. Robbie Glendinning brought home the Curve's second run of the game with a single in the fifth.

**TODAY:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues at Canal Park in Akron, Ohio as the back-to-back Western Division champions conclude a four-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, the Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians.

**THE CURVE:** Altoona is 3-0 at the beginning of the year for the first time since 2010. There are two 4-0 starts in club history that came from the 2000 and 2004 seasons. The longest winning streak to begin the season in team history is a 5-0 start in 2006. Entering 2019, the Curve own the longest active streak for reaching the Eastern League postseason as the only club to make the playoffs in each of the last four seasons. During that span, the Curve own the best record in the Western Division (302-258) while only the only teams in the league with better records are Trenton (329-235) and Reading (305-254). Four consecutive playoff appearances is also tied for the longest streak in franchise history (2003-06).

**THE RUBBERDUCKS:** Akron returned to the playoffs in 2018 and reached the Eastern League Championship Series for the second time in the seasons after defeating the Curve, 3-1, in their best-of-five series last September. The RubberDucks were swept in three games by the New Hampshire Fisher Cats during the Eastern League Championship Series. Akron carries four of the Indians Top 30 prospects on their Opening Day roster including left-handed pitcher and Opening Day starter Sam Hentges (No. 10). Shortstop Ernie Clement (No. 15) and right-handed pitcher James Karinchak (No. 30) return to the team. Outfielder Daniel Johnson (No. 22) joined Cleveland's organization in an off-season trade from the Nationals after he spent the season with Harrisburg. Akron returns three 2018 Eastern League All-Stars in outfielders Andrew Calica and Connor Marabell along with right-handed pitcher Jake Paulson.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Right-handed pitcher Scooter Hightower will start for the Curve on Sunday in his second appearance of the season. Hightower logged a scoreless eighth inning out of the bullpen on Opening Day. The righty from Clarksville, Tenn. make 11 appearances for Altoona in 2018, including seven starts, and turned in a 2-1 record with a 2.41 ERA. He finished the regular season on a 15.1-inning scoreless streak and extended that by one inning in his season debut. This will be his first career appearance against Akron. Hightower was drafted by the Pirates in the 15th round during the 2015 draft out of Columbia State Community College....**For more on Hightower, see page two.**

**FOR AKRON:** Right-hander Zach Plesac climbs the hill for his 2019 season debut. He made four starts with Akron in the regular season in 2018 and started two games in the Eastern League playoffs. Plesac threw six scoreless innings at PNG Field and received one of three wins in the E.L. against the Curve on May 26, 2018. Plesac started Game 3 of the ELDS against the Curve and allowed two runs over 4.1 innings and took a no-decision. Between Akron and A-Adv. Lynchburg in 2018, Plesac went 11-6 with a 3.79 ERA over 26 starts. The Indians drafted the Indiana native in the 12th round of the 2016 draft out of Ball State.

**DEJA VU:** Of eight probable pitcher slots in the opening series, seven of the starting pitchers scheduled to pitch in the took the hill in the 2018 Western Division Series. **Cam Vieaux** started Game 1 for the Curve against Kyle Dowdy, **Eduardo Vera** and Jake Paulson matched up in Game 2, Game 3 pitted **James Marvel** against Zach Plesac and **Dario Agrazal** started opposite Sean Brady in Game 4.

**CHANGING THE NARRATIVE:** With three wins to kick off the series, Altoona has already claimed their first series win of the year and their second straight road series at Canal Park. The Curve have never swept a four-game series in Akron. The team has recorded a trio of three-game sweeps of the Akron Aeros: April 19-21, 2010, June 4-6, 2004 and May 6-8, 2003. The 2010 team swept three games at Canal Park and won the first three games of a four-game set during their second visit of that season to Northeast Ohio. Dating back to last season, the Curve have won six of their last seven and eight of their last 11 regular-season games at Canal Park. Altoona's .405 winning percentage in 205 games as a visitor to the Akron franchise is their lowest in away ballparks among divisional opponents. The only Eastern League ballpark where the Curve have a lower winning percentage is Trenton at .395 (86 total games as a visitor).

**DOING THE SPLITS:** For the first time since the Curve joined the Eastern League in 1999, the Eastern League will play a split-season format beginning in 2019. Playoff berths will be awarded to the division champs in each half and will set the stage for the first round of the postseason. The last time the Eastern League played a split season was in 1982, which was the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

**RYAN'S REIGN:** Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** returns for a third season as Curve manager in 2019. Over the last three years, the Curve have gone 155-126 under Ryan's direction and won back-to-back Western Division titles for the first time in club history. Ryan's .552 winning percentage entering the 2019 season is second-best all-time among Curve managers behind Tony Beasley's .569 mark (161-122) during the 2004-05 seasons. His 155 wins rank fourth all-time in team history (3rd - Tony Beasley, 161). Ryan joins elite company with Dale Sveum (2001-03) and Tim Lincecum (2006-08) as the only managers to hold the post for three seasons. Ryan's coaching career began in Altoona in 2012 before he went on to manage the Single-A West Virginia Power the following two seasons. He managed Bradenton from 2015-16 and won league championships in the Florida State League in 2016 in addition to the Eastern League in 2017. As a player, Ryan was drafted by the Minnesota Twins out of Indiana Area High School in 1996 and went on to play 15 professional seasons, including four in the majors with the Twins from 2002-05 and one with the Angels in 2010.

Pitched three seasons at Columbia State Community College, which also produced major leaguers Gary Matthews, Charlie Mitchell and John Shelby...Pitched in two games in 2013...Went 10-1 with a 2.42 ERA in 14 starts and two relief outings in 2014...Returned in 2015 and went 10-1 with a 1.79 ERA in 11 starts and two relief outings with 113 strikeouts, tied for the most in school history, with 11 walks in 80.0 innings...
