YESTERDAY: The Curve fell, 5-1, in the rubber match of a three-game series in Erie to wrap up a seven-game road trip to start the 2019 season. The SeaWolves' Matt Manning tossed seven one-hit frames and punched out 10 Curve hitters. Erie plated two in the third and a pair in the sixth against Altoona starter Dario Agrazal before they added one more in the seventh against reliever Angel German. The Curve ended the shutout with their lone run in the eighth inning when Arden Pabst hit a sacrifice to bring in Logan Hill.

TONIGHT: The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve return to Peoples Natural Gas Field for the 2019 home opener on Thursday. The Akron RubberDucks come to Altoona to open the Curve's home ballpark for the third straight season.

HOME SWEET HOME (OPENER): The Curve return home to start their 70-game home schedule on Thursday. In their first 20 years as a franchise, Altoona has gone 15-5 all-time in the first game of the season in their home ballpark with wins in two straight. Additionally, the Curve have won seven of their last nine home openers dating back to the 2010 season.

HOME OPENERS vs. AKRON: After a seven-game road trip, the Curve will host Akron in their home opener for the third consecutive season and fourth time overall. Altoona has been victorious in all three previous home openers against Akron. In 2017, the Curve defeated the 'Ducks, 3-2, on April 13 and swept the three-game set. Last year, Altoona hosted Akron on Opening Day and came from behind to take the win, 6-5, before claiming three-of-four games in the series. In 2015, the Curve defeated Akron, 2-1, in the home opener.

THE CURVE: Altoona started the season 5-0 for the second time in team history, matching the record set by the 2006 club, before dropping their last two games on the season-opening road trip to Erie. Entering 2019, the Curve own the longest active streak for reaching the Eastern League postseason as the only club to make the playoffs in each of the last four seasons. Four consecutive playoff appearances is also tied for the longest streak in franchise history (2003-06). Over the last four years, the Curve have the best record in the Western Division (302-258) while only the only teams in the league with better records are Trenton (329-235) and Reading (305-254).

THE RUBBERDUCKS: Akron stumbled out of the games and lost their first six games of the season, including a four-game sweep to the Curve, before picking up their first win on Wednesday night over Trenton. All but two of Akron's six losses were decided by two runs or fewer. Akron reached the playoffs in 2018 as the Western Division wild card club and reached the Eastern League Championship Series for the second time in the three seasons after defeating the Curve, 3-1, in their best-of-five series last September. However, the RubberDucks were swept in three games by the New Hampshire Fisher Cats during the Eastern League Championship Series. Akron carries four of the Indians Top 30 prospects with left-handed pitcher Sam Hentges (No. 10), shortstop Ernie Clement (No. 15), outfielder Daniel Johnson (No. 22) and right-handed pitcher James Karinchak (No. 30) return to the team. Akron also brings back three 2018 Eastern League All-Stars in outfielders Andrew Calica and Connor Marabell along with right-handed pitcher Jake Paulson.

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander **Cam Vieaux** will make his second start of the season against the RubberDucks on Thursday after facing Akron in his season debut last Saturday. Vieaux made 15 starts with the Curve in 2018 and finished tied for the team lead with nine winning decisions to be named Altoona Curve Pitcher of the Year. At PNG Field in 2018, Vieaux went 7-1 in eight starts with a 2.47 ERA compared to a 5.15 ERA and a 2-4 record over seven starts on the road. The Michigan native will make his fifth career start against Akron after going 2-1 with a 2.42 ERA (6 ER/22.1 IP). The Pirates drafted Vieaux in the sixth round in 2016 out of Michigan State...*For more on Vieaux, see page two.*

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Matt Solter will make his Double-A and Indians organization debut tonight in the start for the RubberDucks. The 25-year-old spent the 2018 with the St. Paul Saints of the independent America Association and went 3-5 with a 5.85 ERA. In 80 innings and 15 starts, he struck out 56 hitters and walked 31. Solter returns to affiliated ball for the first time since 2017 when he pitched in the Giants organization with A-Adv. San Jose and Single-A Augusta. Before joining the Giants in 2016, Solter began his professional career in the American Association with the Gary SouthShore RailCats following his college career at Furman University.

MOUND MATTERS: Altoona's pitching staff has issued just 11 walks through the first seven games of the season, which is the fewest walks by any pitching staff in Minor League Baseball. Curve starters have issued just one free pass through 38.1 innings, which is also the fewest among all starting staffs in the minors. Altoona's bullpen has surrendered four runs through seven games, tied for the third-fewest across Double-A and the minors.

KING OF THE HILL: After starting 1-for-8 at the plate through the first three games, **Logan Hill** has gone 8-for-15 (.533) with one homer, three doubles and three RBIs over his past four games. Hill's offensive outburst has propelled him to fifth among Eastern League hitters with a .391 batting average and sits tied for the third with nine total hits. Additionally, his five walks and three doubles are part tied atop the circuit.

BLIGH GUY: With his first Double-A homer and team-best third multi-hit game on Monday, **Bligh Madris** has soared into the Eastern League leaderboards in several categories. His nine total hits and three doubles are tied for tops in the E.L. while his six runs scored are tied for third and four extra-base hits are fourth-best. Madris also started the season on a six-game hitting streak that lasted through Tuesday's action while he went 9-for-26 (.346) at the dish.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve roster features four of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Jared Oliva** (No. 19), **Stephen Alemais** (No. 26), **Gage Hinsz** (No. 28) and **Dario Agrazal** (No. 29). Three of those players are also featured on MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects list: Oliva (No. 12), Alemais (No. 26) and Agrazal (No. 29). Oliva was also ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system.

DOING THE SPLITS: For the first time since the Curve joined the Eastern League in 1999, the Eastern League will play a split-season format beginning in 2019. Playoff berths will be awarded to the division champs in each half and will set the stage for the first round of the postseason. The last time the Eastern League played a split season was in 1982, which was the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

RYAN'S REIGN: Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** returns for a third season as Curve manager in 2019. Over the last three years, the Curve have gone 157-128 under Ryan's direction and won back-to-back Western Division titles for the first time in club history. Ryan's .547 winning percentage entering the 2019 season is second-best all-time among Curve managers behind Tony Beasley's .569 mark (161-122) during the 2004-05 seasons. His 157 wins rank fourth all-time in team history (3rd - Tony Beasley, 161). Ryan joins elite company with Dale Sveum (2001-03) and Tim Leper (2006-08) as the only managers to hold the post for three seasons. Ryan's coaching career began in Altoona in 2012 before he went on to manage the Single-A West Virginia Power the following two seasons. He managed Bradenton from 2015-16 and won league championships in the Florida State League in 2016 in addition to the Eastern League in 2017. As a player, Ryan was drafted by the Minnesota Twins out of Indiana Area High School in 1996 and went on to play 15 professional seasons, including four in the majors with the Twins from 2002-05 and one with the Angels in 2010.
