**YESTERDAY:** The Curve jumped ahead, 2-0, in the third inning but four solo homers by the Senators brought the visitors back late to win, 4-2, in the series opener. James Marvel held Harrisburg to one run over four innings and was removed due to a high pitch count. Jared Oliva played his first game back from the injured list and collected a pair of hits. Stephen Alemais was responsible for both Curve runs when he singled in Oliva and scored on a sacrifice fly by Jerrick Suiter during the Curve's two-run third. Harrisburg scored all four of their runs on solo homers: Chuck Taylor in the fourth, Rhett Wiseman in the sixth and eighth and Drew Ward's go-ahead blast in the eighth.

**TONIGHT:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve play the second game of a three-game set against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals.

**THE CURVE:** Altoona started the season 5-0 for the second time in team history, matching the record set by the 2006 club, taking losses in four of their last five games. Entering 2019, the Curve own the longest active streak for reaching the Eastern League postseason as the only club to make the playoffs in each of the last four seasons. Four consecutive playoff appearances is also tied for the longest streak in franchise history (2003-06). Over the last four years, the Curve have the best record in the Western Division (302-258) while only the only teams in the league with better records are Trenton (329-235) and Reading (305-254).

**THE SENATORS:** Harrisburg brings the best record in Double-A to Altoona for a three-game series with the Curve. Offensively, they currently lead the Eastern League with 55 runs scored and 16 homers while a .258 team average is second-best on the circuit. Harrisburg is managed by Matt LeCroy in 2019, one of four returning managers in the Eastern League from 2018 (**Michael Ryan - Altoona**; Warren Schaeffer - Hartford; Willie Harris - Richmond). The Senators currently carry seven of the Nationals' Top 30 prospects, according to MLB.com: INF Luis Garcia (No. 3), RHP Wil Crowe (No. 5), RHP Sterling Sharp (No. 9), RHP James Bourque (No. 18), C Tres Barrera (No. 21), LHP Taylor Guilbeau (No. 24) and LHP Ben Braymer (No. 25). Garcia is also ranked by MLB.com as baseball's No. 73 overall prospect.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Right-hander **Dario Agrazal** makes his third start of the season and his first home start of the campaign on Tuesday. In his previous start, he was handed the loss after Erie scored four runs on 11 hits last Wednesday. Eight of the SeaWolves' 11 hits were singles compared to three doubles, two of which scored the first two runs of the game during a two-run third frame. Tuesday's starting nod is Agrazal's 19th Double-A start and his first appearance against the Senators. A native of Panama, Agrazal was signed by the Pirates as an international free agent in 2012 and is ranked as the Pirates' No. 29 prospect by *Baseball America*. *For more on Agrazal, see page two.*

**FOR HARRISBURG:** Right-hander Erick Fedde makes his third start of the season for Harrisburg and his first since leading the charge on a combined no-hitter on Thursday at Bowie. The 2014 first-round draft pick by the Nationals hurled six hitless frames with one walk and a hit batter before relievers Jordan Mills and Aaron Barrett finished off the first no-no of the minor league season. Fedde has spent parts of the last four seasons with Harrisburg, going a combined 6-5 with a 3.40 ERA across 25 Double-A outings. In four career appearances against Altoona, Fedde is 2-0 with a 0.66 ERA. The Las Vegas native played collegiately at UNLV and made his Major League debut with the Nationals on July 30, 2017 against Colorado. He split the 2018 season between Triple-A Syracuse and Washington and owns a MLB career mark of 2-5 with a 6.44 ERA.

**OFFENSIVE OUTPUT:** **Jared Oliva** and **Stephen Alemais** combined to go 4-for-7 with multi-hit performances in their first game as the Curve's 1-2 duo at the top of the lineup. Through the first 10 games of the season, Altoona hitters in the leadoff and second spot of order hit .191 (13-for-68) with two multi-hit outings, each by **Bralin Jackson**. Altoona's 3-6 hitters, **Bligh Madris**, **Jerrick Suiter**, **Logan Hill** and **Hunter Owen**, have hit a combined .305 (47-for-154) through the young season while their 47 total hits account for 58 percent of the team's total output. With runners in scoring position, the Curve hit .321 in the clutch on the season-opening road trip before stumbling to a .183 (6-for-33) mark over the last four games at home.

**BULLPEN BLUES:** Altoona relievers started the season by limiting their opponents to four runs over their first 22.2 innings of work. Over the last four games at home, the unit has allowed 18 runs in 15.2 innings. With a total of 22 runs allowed through 11 games, only Trenton's bullpen has surrendered more runs than the Curve 'pen among Eastern League staffs.

**BLIGH GUY:** **Bligh Madris** delivered his fifth career walk-off hit in Thursday's home opener with a single in the bottom of the 12th inning to lift the Curve, 3-2, over Akron. With A-Adv. Bradenton in 2018, the Las Vegas native connect on three walk-off hits, most recently a walk-off homer on August 21 vs. Charlotte. Madris ranks fourth in the Eastern League with 15 hits and four doubles while his eight runs are third-best on the circuit. Additionally, his .326 average is 14th-best in the E.L.

**BOUNTY HUNTER:** Third baseman **Hunter Owen** is batting .333 (9-for-27) with three doubles, two homers and seven RBIs and owns an eight-game on-base streak. Owen's 12 RBIs and three homers on the campaign are third-most in the E.L.. He also ranks in the league's top-10 in hits (11), extra-base hits (6), doubles (3), slugging percentage (.639), on-base percentage (.405) and runs scored (7).

**SUIT UP:** In his return to Altoona, **Jerrick Suiter** is hitting .314 with 11 hits. Suiter spent 2018 with Triple-A Indianapolis and hit .204 over 67 games following a .285 showing over his first 100 games at Double-A during the 2017 season with Altoona.

**DOING THE SPLITS:** For the first time since the Curve joined the Eastern League in 1999, the Eastern League will play a split-season format beginning in 2019. Playoff berths will be awarded to the division champs in each half and will set the stage for the first round of the postseason. The last time the Eastern League played a split season was in 1982, which was the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve roster features four of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Jared Oliva** (No. 19), **Stephen Alemais** (No. 26), **Gage Hinsz** (No. 28) and **Dario Agrazal** (No. 29). Three of those players are also featured on MLB.com's Top 30 Pirates prospects list: Oliva (No. 12), Alemais (No. 26) and Agrazal (No. 29). Oliva was also ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system.
