**THE LAST TIME OUT:** The Curve had their three-game winning streak broken with a 4-2 loss to the Senators on Monday. Harrisburg's Luis Sardinas scored on a double by Austin Davidson in the first and scored again in the third to make it 2-0 on a sacrifice fly by Dante Bichette Jr. Bichette would knock in two more when he unloaded on a two-run triple in the fifth to open a 4-0 advantage. For Altoona, Jerrick Suiter doubled home Jared Oliva with two outs in the fifth before Oliva delivered a run-scoring single in the sixth. The Curve loaded the bases in the ninth but failed to score and left a season-high-tying 14 runners on base in the defeat.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve complete the first half against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. It is the second of a three-game series and the final series in Altoona between the Route 22 Rivals. The two clubs will meet on City Island for three games in August and will finish the regular season over four games during Labor Day weekend.

**SPLIT WHILE YOU'RE AHEAD:** Tuesday is the 76th day of Eastern League play and the final day of first half action. The Western Division was clinched by Harrisburg last Wednesday while the Eastern Division remains up for grabs. The first half champions will host Games 3-5, if necessary, in the Division Series round of the E.L. playoffs. The second half will begin immediately with Wednesday's games and due to rainouts or uneven scheduling, Harrisburg will be the only club in the league with even, 70-game halves. Altoona is experiencing a split season for the first time since joining the Eastern League in 1999. The last time the E.L. used the format was in 1982 at the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

**THE CURVE:** The Curve are an Eastern League-best 11-4 in June. They have won four straight series after sweeping Erie and Binghamton on their last two road trips and a 5-2 homestand against Akron and Portland. Despite a .232 (110/474) team average this month, Altoona has hammered 12 homers in June after a league-low 30 home runs through the first two months of the season. Curve pitchers entered play May 16 with a 4.22 ERA, which ranked last in the league, before a 3.09 ERA (83 ER/241.2 IP), fourth-lowest in the league over that period, over the last 28 games brought it down to 3.74. In June, Altoona pitchers have the third-lowest ERA (2.61) in the league after carrying the highest in the E.L. during May (5.00).

**THE SENATORS:** Harrisburg snapped a five-year playoff drought by winning the First Half Western Division title. With the Senators as the first team to reach the postseason, the Erie SeaWolves now own the longest dry spell in the Western Division (2013). The Senators had a red-hot 21-4 record in April before going 21-23 since. The Senators offense paced the league with 28 homers in April but have hit a league-low 26 home runs since May 1 while hitting at a .232 pace and 162 runs scored, each third lowest in the league over that time. From a pitching perspective, the Senators have been consistently one of the best units in the league, ranking second in team ERA (3.26).

**FOR ALTOONA:** Left-handed pitcher **Brandon Waddell** will make his first start of the season after he made 21 relief outings with Triple-A Indianapolis to start the season. A native of Houston, Waddell has spent the majority of his pro career with Double-A Altoona by pitching 237.2 innings of 410.2 career frames in a Curve uniform. He reached Double-A in his first full season in 2016 and went 12-13 with a 3.64 ERA over 46 outings before his first Triple-A promotion at the end of May 2018. He was originally drafted by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2015 draft out of the University of Virginia, where he won the 2015 College World Series...*For more on Waddell, see page two.*

**FOR HARRISBURG:** Right-hander Tyler Mapes takes the mound for his 12th start overall and second of the season against the Curve. In his last start, the 27-year-old allowed five runs, three earned, over five innings against Binghamton on June 6 before he landed on the 7-day injured list until June 14. Mapes pitched against the Curve at PNC Field on May 19 and allowed four runs over 5.2 innings of a no-decision. He is making his 45 Double-A start, going 16-14 with a 3.57 ERA during his time with the Senators since 2016. A native of Plano, Texas, Mapes was drafted by the Nationals out of Tulane during the 30th round in 2014.

**BOUNTY HUNTER: Hunter Owen** hammered his league-leading 15th homer on Saturday night. He ranks in the top three in most major offensive categories, including the league lead in five: home runs (15), runs (44), hits (67), hit-by-pitch (11) and total bases (130). The Indiana State product stands second in three categories: RBIs (43), extra-base hits (31) and slugging percentage (.570). Additionally, his batting average (.294) and OPS (.938) are third-highest in the league. Since the start of the 2017 season, Owen has hit the most home runs (46) by any Pirates minor leaguer. He is currently on pace for 32 homers in 2019, which would break Adam Hyzdu's franchise record of 31 during the 2000 season. Pittsburgh's 25th round pick in 2016 is also on pace rank in the top five in club history in RBIs (92), runs (93) and extra-base hits (66). Owen is also on pace to break Chris Duffy's record of 20 hit-by-pitch. *For more on single-season club records, see page 100 of the Curve Media Guide.* Owen has hit safely in 25 of his last 35 games since May 7 while batting .298 (37/124) with eight homers and 17 RBIs.

**OLIVA COMING ALIVE: Jared Oliva** is riding a season-best 13-game on-base streak, the second-longest active streak in the league. He has hit safely in 10 of those 13 games with a .255 (13/51) average, three multi-hit games, four doubles, two homers, three steals, 10 runs and five walks since June 3. The Pirates' seventh round choice in 2017 out of Arizona was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his recent run. A native of Southern California, Oliva was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 for A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases.

**BLIGH GUY: Bligh Madris** is heating up in June and has collected 14 hits over his last 14 games since June 2, batting .311 (14/45) with two homers, four doubles, one triple, eight walks and eight RBIs. Now with 14 doubles on the season, Madris has already set a new single-season career best in that category. Madris hit .326 (29/89) over his first 21 games at Double-A through April 28 with seven doubles and nine RBIs before slumping to a .156 (14/90) pace over his next 28 from April 29-June 1 with three doubles and five RBIs. Madris is a Las Vegas native and was a DII standout at Colorado Mesa before he was drafted in 2017 during the ninth round by the Pirates.

**SUMMER CATCH:** Altoona catchers **Jason Delay** and **Arden Pabst** have the most extra-base hits (24) and RBIs (39) than any other catching unit in the Eastern League. Pabst, drafted out of Georgia Tech, has 11 RBIs in his last 14 games with seven extra-base hits, including two homers, while batting .294 (15/51). Delay, who played collegiately at Vanderbilt, is hitting .277 (23/83) with five homers, six doubles, one triple and 20 RBIs over his last 22 games.

**ROBBIE'S RETURN: Robbie Glendinning**, a member of the Curve's Opening Day roster, was promoted from A-Adv. Bradenton on Thursday and has gone 2-for-9 with a homer on Friday and six walks in three games. Glendinning hit .300 (6/20) over nine games before he was sent to Bradenton on April 18. The native of Australia tore up the Florida State League with league-best a .340 average, .599 slugging percentage and .992 OPS and ranked fourth in the league with eight homers and 16 doubles at the time of his promotion. His .330 average between the two levels leads all hitters in the Pirates organization. Without Glendinning's production at the shortstop position, Curve shortstops are batting .200 (42/210), which would rank 11th on the circuit.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve active roster features one of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19). Oliva is ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com ranks Oliva as the No. 9 overall prospect in the Pirates organization and RHP **Blake Cederlind** is rated No. 30.
