**THE LAST TIME OUT:** The Curve and Rumble Ponies split a double-header on Saturday, 2-1 and 4-3. Binghamton took game one behind six stellar innings from knuckleballer Mickey Jannis. A 45-minute rain delay ended his bid for a complete-game shutout as right-hander Stephen Villines took over with a pair of runners on base when **Jerrick Suiter** hit the first pitch to left field and Barrett Barnes robbed him of a walk-off, three-run homer before holding on for the win. In the second game, Altoona led 2-1 after two innings before the Ponies tied it up in the fifth. The game went to extras as the clubs exchanged runs with the placed runner in the eighth. In the bottom of the ninth, **Chris Sharpe** bounced a game-winning single over the head of Binghamton second baseman Luis Carpio that scored **Gift Ngoepe** for the winning run.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve play the rubber match of their five-game series and final game of the season series against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. Altoona has won 6 of their last 7 series and are 4-4 in series-deciding game in 2019. The Curve are playing the final contest of 16 straight National League-style games and will use the designated hitter for all but four games in July.

**THE CURVE:** The Curve are 18-9 in June, trailing only Bowie (20-6) for the best record in the Eastern League this month. The Curve have won at least 18 games in a month 16 times in team history and reached 19 wins in a month on seven occasions, including three 20-win months. Altoona has the best intra-division record (31-21) in their half of the league but are 10-16 against the Eastern Division. The Curve have reached the E.L. Playoffs in each of the last four seasons, the longest active streak in the league and tied for the longest run in franchise history (2003-06).

**THE RUMBLE PONIES:** Binghamton, a league-worst 9-18 in June, have lost 8 of 11 and are 10-19 since starting the final day of May in first place with a 30-18 record. The Rumble Ponies have won one series this month, a three-game sweep at New Hampshire on June 18-20. Binghamton is the best road team in the league with a 28-14 mark away from NYSEG Stadium. The Rumble Ponies lead the Eastern League with 4.3 runs per game, rank second in total team batting average (.245) and third with runners in scoring position (.260) but have hit the fewest homers (44) on the circuit. The pitching staff ranks 11th with a 3.86 ERA.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Eastern League All-Star and right-hander **James Marvel** makes the his team-high 16th start of the season. Marvel, the Curve's Opening Day starter, has been on a roll in June with a league-best four wins and 35 strikeouts this month while carrying a 2.14 ERA. In his latest start on Tuesday, Marvel struck out eight over seven one-run innings, giving up just a second-inning solo homer to Richmond's Gio Brusa for a fourth straight winning decision and league-high eighth. A native of the Bay Area, Marvel was drafted by the Pirates in the 36th round in 2015 after injury limited the righty to just 13 collegiate outings at Duke University. **For more on Marvel, see page two.**

**FOR BINGHAMTON:** Right-hander Austin McGeorge comes off the 7-day injured list to make his 12 appearance and second start of the season. His season debut on May 5 was his first professional start and he last worked on June 21 with three one-run innings against Richmond. Eight of his 11 previous outings have gone multiple innings. He reached Double-A for the first time in 2018 and went 1-1 with a 7.96 ERA after going 1-1 next to a 2.73 ERA in 21 outings for A-Adv. St. Lucie. McGeorge was drafted in the seventh round in 2016 out of Long Beach State.

**NO OFFENSE:** The Eastern League batting average stands at .237 while teams are scoring 3.96 runs per game. The last time the league average finished under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249/3.95). The last time the E.L. saw offenses hit below .240 and score fewer than 4.0 runs per game was in 1971 (.234/3.57). Altoona is right at league average with 3.96 runs per game and rank third in hitting at .244. The lowest batting average in team history is .252 during the 2013 season.

**GLOVE TRAIN:** The Curve defense has the highest fielding percentage (.985) and have committed the second-fewest errors (43) in the Minors while turning the third-most double plays (75) among Double-A clubs. Curve defenders have made plays on a high rate of balls in play while pitchers have the fewest strikeouts (550) in the Minors and the fifth-fewest walks (217) in Double-A. The Curve have set the franchise record for highest team fielding percentage in each of the last three seasons, which was .980 in 2016 and 2017 before the 2018 club held a .985 mark.

**BRAKE MEN:** Curve pitchers entered play on May 16 with a 4.22 ERA, which ranked last in the league. The staff has lowered that mark to 3.63 over the last 40 games by holding 3.08 ERA (118 ER/344.2 IP), the third-best mark in the league over that period. In June, Altoona pitchers have the second-lowest ERA (2.81) in the league after carrying the highest in the E.L. during May (5.00). Additionally, the bullpen owns a 2.42 ERA (20 ER/74.1 IP) over the last 24 games that included an eight-game stretch of 22 consecutive scoreless innings from June 12-June 21.

**G'DAYS FOR ROBBIE:** **Robbie Glendinning** keeps hitting to lead the Pirates organization with a .341 average between Altoona and A-Adv. Bradenton while pacing the system with 79 total hits. He also owns career-best totals with 11 homers, 20 doubles and 43 RBIs. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star, the Western Australian native is hitting .360 (18/50) with six extra-base hits, 13 RBIs and six walks in his last 14 games since he rejoined the Curve on June 13. Glendinning was on the Curve's Opening Day roster and hit .300 (6/20) over nine games before he was sent to down on April 18. He responded with a FSL-best a .340 average, .599 slugging percentage and .992 OPS over 43 games with the Marauders.

**OLIVA COMING ALIVE:** **Jared Oliva** has reached base in 22 of his last 24 games since June 3 while batting .302 (26/86) with seven multi-hit games, nine doubles (leads E.L. in June), two homers, 11 RBIs, eight steals, 14 runs and 11 walks. He was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his recent upswing to .235. Over his last 14 games, he is hitting .347 (17/49) with eight doubles, seven steals and seven walks. Oliva's 16 steals are third-most in the E.L. and ranks tied for second in the Pirates system. He was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 for A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases.

**BLIGH GUY:** **Bligh Madris** has enjoyed a fruitful June by batting .271 (23/85) since June 2 with three homers, five doubles, one triple, 11 walks and 14 RBIs during seven multi-hit games. Madris hit .326 (29/89) over his first 21 games at Double-A through April 28 with seven doubles and nine RBIs before slumping to a .156 (14/90) pace with three doubles and five RBIs over his next 28 from April 29-June 1.

**TOLMAN AT THE TOP:** Since taking over the leadoff role on June 19, **Mitchell Tolman** has hit .371 (13/35) and been on base in 9 of 10 games with 11 runs scored. Tolman has led off in 18 games this season and owns a .313 (21/67) ledger from the top of the lineup. Since June 3, he has reached base in 21 of 24 and is batting .322 (29/90) with 15 runs, seven steals and five extra-base hits.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve active roster features two of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19) and right-handed pitcher **Cody Bolton** (No. 21). Oliva is ranked by B.A. as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com has three Top 30 Pirates prospects in Altoona with Oliva (No. 9), Bolton (No. 23) and right-handed reliever **Blake Cederlind** (No. 30).

**HANG A STAR ON THAT ONE:** The Eastern League announced the rosters for the 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game on Monday, which included three members of the Altoona Curve roster: right-handed pitchers **James Marvel** and **Pedro Vasquez** along with catcher **Jason Delay**. Delay and Marvel have been selected to their first All-Star Game while Vasquez picks up his second (2017 Florida State League with A-Adv. Bradenton). The 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game will be in Richmond on Wednesday, July 10.
