THE LAST TIME OUT: The Curve tied a franchise record by striking out 17 times and were held to two hits against Erie on Sunday, but SeaWolves pitchers issued five walks that turned into three runs to lift Altoona to a 3-2 win and a three-game series sweep. Tarik Skubal made his Double-A debut for Erie and struck out 11 over five innings but his throwing error on a pickoff attempt in the fourth placed **Jared Oliva** at third base for **Bligh Madris**, who delivered a two-out RBI single that tied the game, 1-1. Erie took a brief 2-1 lead in the sixth but Madris came through again with two outs when Anthony Castro walked two and Altoona's right fielder doubled in both runners. The series sweep for the Curve was the fourth of the season for the club.

TODAY'S GAME: The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve pick up play after the All-Star Break with the start of a four-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. It is the final series in Erie for the Curve in 2019 before the 23-game season series concludes with four games at PNG Field from July 22-24, including a double-header on July 23. The last six games between the two teams have all gone to the Curve with back-to-back three-game sweeps. With play resuming after the All-Star Break, the Curve are set to embark on the homestretch of the season with 54 games (and one suspended game) in the next 54 days.

THE CURVE: The Curve have won four in a row, 7 of 8 and are a season-best nine games over .500 for the best full-season record (47-38) in the Western Division. Since June 1, the club is 24-10, the second-best record in the league behind Bowie (26-8) over that period, and have also won 9 of 10 series. Altoona has the best intra-division record (36-22) among Western Division clubs and have reached the E.L. Playoffs in each of the last four seasons, the longest active streak in the league and tied for the longest run in franchise history (2003-06).

THE SEAWOLVES: The SeaWolves won 13 of 15 to start the second half but have lost three straight for the first time since they were swept at UPMC Park by the Curve on June 3-5. Owner's of the largest run differential in the league (+46), the SeaWolves lead the league in hitting at .247 and rank fifth with 4.1 runs per game. From a pitching perspective, Erie's starting rotation paces the circuit with a collective 3.08 ERA while the bullpen is ranked 11th with a 3.61 ERA to give the entire staff a 3.29 ERA, second-best in the E.L.

FOR ALTOONA: Left-handed pitcher **Sean Brady** will make his 12th start for the Curve and 17th outing overall in 2019. In his last start on July 4, Brady pitched seven innings against the SeaWolves and settled in nicely after a first inning, two-run homer by Jose Azocar for the only two runs he allowed. Today's start will be his sixth career outing against Erie and second of this season. He spent the first six years of his professional career in the Indians organization and was released by Cleveland on May 1 and signed with the Pirates on May 6. He was originally drafted by the Indians in the fifth round of the 2013 draft out of high school...*For more on Brady, see page three.*

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Logan Shore makes 15th appearance and 13th start. He last pitched 6.1 innings on July 3 against Binghamton and allowed one run in a no-decision. Shore has pitched against the Curve three previous times this season and is 1-2 with 5.06 ERA (9 ER/16 IP) but fired six, two-run innings and seven strikeouts in his last head-to-head with Altoona on June 4. A native of Coon Rapids, Minn., Shore pitched collegiately at Florida and was a second round pick by the Oakland Athletics in 2016 before the Tigers acquired him last September as one of the players to be named later in the Mike Fiers trade on August 6, 2018.

RYAN'S REIGN: Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** is nearing the 200-win milestone as Curve manager. His 199 wins are third-most in club history behind Dale Sveum (2001-03) and Tim Lincecum (2006-08), each at 213 wins. Ryan's .548 winning percentage is also the second-highest in franchise history behind Tony Beasley's .569 (2004-05). Over his seven-year managerial career, Ryan is a two-time league champion and is 479-433.

TOUGH YEAR TO HIT: The league-wide average stands at .237 with teams scoring 3.97 runs per game. The last time the league average finished under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249/3.95) while 1971 (.234/3.57) was the last season offenses hit below .240 and scored fewer than 4.0 runs per game. The Curve are above the league average with 4.02 runs per game and rank third in hitting at .245. The lowest batting average in team history stands at .252 during the 2013 season.

BRAKE MEN: Since June 3, the Curve pitching staff own's a 2.84 ERA (88 ERA/279.0 IP), the best mark in the league. The staff has also pitched to a 3.07 ERA (139 ER/407.2 IP) over the last 47 games since May 16, third-best in the E.L. After a 6.82 ERA over 12 games from May 3-15, the club's ERA ballooned to a league-high 4.22 but has been trimmed down to 3.58 due to the prolonged run of success. Additionally, the bullpen owns a 2.18 ERA (24 ER/99.0 IP) over the last 31 games.

G'DAYS FOR ROBBIE: **Robbie Glendinning**, has racked up 18 RBIs in 21 games, fourth-most in the E.L. since June 14, while batting .316 (24/76) with nine extra-base hits. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star, the Western Australia native tops the Pirates minor league system with a .329 average (min. 250 plate appearances), 85 hits and tied for first with 23 doubles. He also ranks among the top performers in the Pirates system with 11 homers (6th) and 48 RBIs (5th), all career-highs. Glendinning was on the Curve's Opening Day roster and hit .300 (6/20) over nine games before he was sent to down to A-Adv. Bradenton on April 18, where he led the FSL with a .340 average, .599 slugging percentage and .992 OPS over 43 games.

OLIVA COMING ALIVE: **Jared Oliva** is leading the E.L. is hitting since June 14 with a .411 (30/73) average, 1.069 OPS, .494 on-base percentage and 15 steals in 20 games to go with nine doubles and 10 multi-hit games. He has reached base in 29 of his last 31 games since June 3 at a .355 (39/110) pace with 12 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three homers, 14 RBIs, 16 steals, 21 runs and 15 walks. He was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his up-tick to .264. Oliva's 24 steals this year rank second in the E.L. and Pirates system. He was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 for A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases, third-most in the system.

LOOKIN' SHARPE: **Chris Sharpe's** 16 RBIs since his promotion to Double-A on June 21 are second-most in the E.L. He has collected 13 of those RBIs in the last eight games that included a walk-off single last Saturday, a go-ahead grand slam on Sunday, drove in three during a comeback win on Monday, sparked a four-run eighth on Wednesday with a solo homer, and a three-RBI night on July 4 that included a two-run homer. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star for A-Adv. Bradenton, Sharpe ranks fourth in the Pirates system with .273 overall batting average (min. 250 plate appearances), second with a .361 on-base percentage and third with 15 stolen bases.

TOLMAN AT THE TOP: Since taking over the leadoff role on June 19, **Mitchell Tolman** has reached base in 15 of 16 games, including 11 in a row, while hitting at a .323 (20/62) pace with 17 runs scored, tied for the most in the league since the start of the second half. Tolman has hit leadoff in 24 games this season and owns a .298 (28/94) ledger from the top of the lineup. Since June 3, he has been on base in 27 of 30 and is batting .308 (36/117) with 21 runs, eight steals and seven extra-base hits.

BLIGH GUY: **Bligh Madris** has reached base in nine straight games and owns a .375 average (12/32) with four extra-base hits and four multi-hit games since June 29. He has reached base in 27 of his last 32 since June 2, batting .297 (33/111) with four homers, eight doubles, one triple, 13 walks and 20 RBIs during 11 multi-hit performances. Madris hit .326 (29/89) over his first 21 games at Double-A through April 28 with seven doubles and nine RBIs before slumping to a .156 (14/90) pace with three doubles and five RBIs over his next 28 from April 29-June 1.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve active roster features two of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19) and right-handed pitcher **Cody Bolton** (No. 21). Oliva is ranked by B.A. as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com has three Top 30 Pirates prospects in Altoona with Oliva (No. 9), Bolton (No. 23) and right-handed reliever **Blake Cederlind** (No. 30).

Ryan returns for his third season in Altoona after guiding the Curve to back-to-back Western Division championships. In his first season, the Curve captured the 2017 Eastern League title. He also managed the Western Division All-Stars in the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Classic. Ryan started his coaching career as a coach for the Curve in 2012. He is in his seventh season as a manager in the Pirates organization, leading the Bradenton Marauders from 2015-16 and the West Virginia Power from 2014-15. He steered Bradenton to a 70-66 record in 2016 and won the Florida State League championship. Ryan played 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors, after he was a fifth-round draft choice by the Minnesota Twins in 1996.

Hanrahan joins the Curve in 2019 for his third season as a pitching coach in the Pittsburgh minor league system. He started his coaching career with the Bristol Pirates in 2017 and most recently oversaw pitchers for the West Virginia Power last year. Hanrahan was a two-time National League All-Star with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2011 and 2012 while he served as the team's closer. He was the first Buccs closer to notch 40 saves in a single season and recorded 82 saves, fifth all-time, during four seasons in Pittsburgh. A second-round pick by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2000, he played 14 totals seasons and seven years as a right-handed reliever in the majors.

Nunnally comes to the Curve for his first year in the Pirates organization and 12th season as a coach in professional baseball. During the 2010-11 seasons, he was the hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians under manager Manny Acta. Nunnally spent the last two seasons as the Minor League Outfield and Baserunning Coordinator for the Los Angeles Angels. He has served as a hitting coach in the Indians, Toronto Blue Jays and Boston Red Sox developmental systems with Eastern League stops in New Hampshire (2012, 14) and Portland (2016). As a player, Nunnally was drafted by Cleveland in the third round in 1992 and played 15 seasons. He also played six major league seasons.

Paniagua joins the Curve for his third season as a coach in the Pirates organization. He started his coaching career in 2017 with the Bristol Pirates and was the hitting coach for the Dominican Summer League affiliate last year. He played for 13 years as an international signee out of the Dominican Republic. Paniagua spent parts of six seasons as a member of the Boston Red Sox and New York Mets minor league systems that included Eastern League experience with Portland (2007) and Binghamton (2008-09). He also spent six seasons (2011-16) with the independent York Revolution and is the longest-tenured position player in franchise history.

In his eighth season as a member of the Pittsburgh organization, Ahrens returns to Altoona for a third season in 2019. In 2018, Ahrens was the trainer for the Western Division for the Eastern League All-Star Classic. He spent two years in Bradenton from 2015-16, where he was named Florida State League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2016. He spent each the last six seasons on the same staff as manager Michael Ryan. Ahrens received a bachelor's degree in athletic training from Carroll University in 2011, and a master's degree in kinesiology from Fresno Pacific University in 2016.

Schlesinger returns to the Curve for his third season, after making stops at Jamestown, West Virginia and Bradenton within the Pittsburgh system. In 2018, Ahrens was the trainer for the Western Division for the Eastern League All-Star Classic. Prior to joining the Pirates, he served as the strength and conditioning graduate assistant at Duquesne University from 2012-2014. Schlesinger graduated from Toledo with a degree in exercise science in 2011 and completed his master's degree of science in sports leadership at Duquesne in 2014.
