THE LAST TIME OUT: The Curve led 2-0 for the second straight night before Reading charged back with seven unanswered runs, including a five-run fifth, to claim a 7-2 win on Saturday. Jack Conley socked a solo homer with two outs in the fifth off Curve starter Cody Bolton, who held Reading to two baserunners before five straight reached. The five-run outburst was capped off by a three-run, tie-breaking homer by Alec Bohm. Jared Oliva drove in Altoona's first score in the fourth and Robbie Glendinning hit his fifth homer in the fifth.

TODAY'S GAME: Altoona plays the finale of a three-game series versus the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. After losing the first two contests of the series, the Curve took to avoid their first sweep since May 21-23 at New Hampshire. Altoona has been swept just twice all season with a three-game series on April 15-17 versus Harrisburg joining the aforementioned set in New Hampshire. The Curve will host the R-Phils next weekend, August 9-11, to conclude the season series at PNG Field. In 2018, Altoona went 6-4 against Reading.

THE CURVE: The Curve have lost 11 of 13 and are 5-17 since July 14 to tumble below .500 for the first time since June 8. Over the last 22 games since July 14, Altoona is batting a league-low .226 (156/691) and are averaging 3.2 runs per game, the second-lowest rate in the E.L. over that period. From a pitching perspective, the team's 4.37 ERA since July 14 is the highest in the league and the Curve have been outscored 101-71 in 22 games since that date. After losing the first two of the weekend at FirstEnergy Stadium, the Curve have lost six straight series and have not won a set since the All-Star Break. Altoona went 25-10 from June 3-July 13 to climb from a season-low five games under .500 (24-29) to a season-best 10 games over (49-39). The Curve have reached the E.L. Playoffs in each of the last four seasons, the longest active streak in the league and tied for the longest run in franchise history (2003-06).

THE FIGHTIN PHILS: Reading has the best record in the Eastern League and tied for third-best in Double-A. Leading the Eastern Division in the Second Half, the R-Phils were defeated by a tie-breaker in the First Half by Trenton for the first ticket to the postseason. Reading's offense is fueled by the league's second-most homers (90) and stolen bases (95) while leading the league in walks (416) despite ranking 10th in the E.L. with a .234 batting average and .239 average with runners in scoring position. The Fightin Phils' 9.5 SO/9 IP by their pitchers is the best rate in the league with the fifth-best ERA (3.51) and third-lowest bullpen ERA (2.89). Reading's last league title was captured in 2001 and the team last reached the playoffs in 2016 but were defeated by Trenton in the ELDS.

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Domingo Robles makes his 13th Double-A start and 23rd overall in the Pirates system. During his last start, he took a 3-2 lead into the final frame of a seven-inning game on July 30 at Trenton and recorded the first out of the inning before three straight hits for the Thunder led to a walk-off, 4-3 loss for Robles. Robles was the Opening Day starter for A-Adv. Bradenton this season and went 5-5 with a 2.61 ERA in 10 Florida State League starts before his promotion on May 28. Robles, a 21-year-old native of the Dominican Republic, was signed by Pittsburgh as an international free agent on July 2, 2014. For more on Robles, see page two.

FOR READING: Adonis Medina, a 22-year-old right-hander, takes the mound for his 18th start. A 2019 Eastern League All-Star, Medina started the All-Star Game on July 10 at The Diamond and allowed a run in the opening inning. Over his last two starts, Medina has lost both games against New Hampshire and has a 16.20 ERA (12 ER/6.2 IP), including four allowed over four innings in his most recent start. He trimmed his ERA to 3.53 ERA with seven one-run frames at Binghamton on July 15, his first outing since the All-Star Break. Medina recorded more strikeouts than innings pitched in 2017 with Class A Lakewood (133 in 119.2 IP) and A-Adv. Clearwater in 2018 (123 in 111.1 IP). The Phillies signed Medina as an international free agent on May 29, 2014 and is regarded by MLB.com as Philadelphia's top pitching prospect, No. 2 overall in the system and No. 92 in baseball.

YEAR OF THE PITCHER: Brian Keller's no-hitter against the Curve during Thursday's double-header in Trenton was the Eastern League's eighth in 2019, the most since a league record nine no-nos occurred in 1967. Eastern League pitchers in 2019 have handcuffed hitters to a .239 league-wide batting average with teams scoring 3.98 runs per game. The last year the league average finished below .240 and fewer than 4.0 runs were scored per game was in 1971 (.234/.357). The league average has finished under .240 just five times since becoming a Double-A league in 1963: 1971 (.234), 1968 (.219), 1967 (.228), 1966 (.234) and 1965 (.236). Strikeouts have also spiked to 8.7 SO/9 IP, the highest ratio in league history going back to the earliest data available in 1965.

BRAKE MEN: Altoona's bullpen has been a lockdown unit since mid-June, owning a 2.48 ERA (43 ER/156.1 IP) over 47 games since June 12. Curve relievers own a 2.53 ERA (12 ER/42.2 IP) in the last 14 games worked since July 22. Blake Cederlind has a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) in his last 14 games since June 14. Over 10 outings since June 26, Joel Cesar has thrown seven scoreless games with a 1.72 ERA (3 ER/15.2 IP). Yeudy Garcia has anchored a 2.93 ERA (9 ER/27.2 IP) in 15 games since May 30. During his last 21 games since May 19, Angel German has yanked his ERA down from 7.07 to 4.43 with 15 scoreless outings, allowing just 15 hits, struck out 27 and has a 2.93 ERA (9 ER/27.2 IP). In parts of two seasons with the Curve, Jesus Liranzo has allowed just one earned run over 28.2 innings. Matt Eckelman is the ninth player in club history to record 20 saves in a single season while his 31 career saves with Altoona trail only Montana DuRapa's team record of 38. Eckelman has allowed just two earned runs, four total, in 22 games since the start of June for a 0.73 ERA (2 ER/24.2 IP).

CRUZ CONTROL: One of baseball's top prospects, Oneil Cruz, joined the Curve at the start of the current road trip, nearly two years to the day after he was acquired as an 18-year-old from the Los Angeles Dodgers in a trade for former Curve pitcher Tony Watson. Cruz is the 11th 20-year-old to play for the Curve and the first since Cole Tucker made his Double-A debut on July 20, 2017. Cruz was limited to 35 games for A-Adv. Bradenton due to a right-foot fracture in late April but he still hammered seven homers the Marauders. Since he was activated from the injured list on June 30 until his promotion, Cruz led the Florida State League with six homers in 24 games with a .330 (31/94) average, 13 RBIs and 18 runs. In six games with Altoona, all three of his hits are for extra bases.

J.O. KEEPS HITTING: Jared Oliva has 11 multi-hit games and has hit safely in 19 of his last 22 games since July 13, batting .365 (31/85). He finished July with a league-best .388 (40/103) batting average, 40 hits and 13 steals over 27 games. Going back to June 3, Oliva has raised his batting average from a season-low .188 to .285, fifth-best in the E.L., by hitting safely in 48 of 55 games at a .352 (72/203) pace and .421 on-base percentage, both the highest rates in the league over that period. In the stolen base department, Oliva ranks second on the E.L. circuit and first in the Pirates system with 31 steals for the year and is the ninth player in club history to surpass 30 stolen bases in a single season.

BIG FLY BLIGH: Out of seven total home runs hit by Bligh Madris, five have been either go-ahead or game-tying homers in Curve wins. He has also connected on three other game-winning hits, including a walk-off single on April 11, Altoona's home opener and the fifth walk-off hit of his pro career. Madris ranks 13th in the E.L. and seventh in the Pirates system with 95 hits and is second on the club with 27 multi-hit games to go with a career-best 21 doubles.

TOLMAN AT THE TOP: Since taking over the leadoff role on June 19, Mitchell Tolman has reached base in 34 of 40 games while hitting .250 (37/148). Since the start of the Second Half, Tolman has scored a league-high 29 runs scored, drawn the second-most walks with 24 and ranks 10th with a .369 on-base percentage.

PRODUCING AFTER PROMOTIONS: Robbie Glendinning and Chris Sharpe, a pair of 2019 Florida State League All-Stars, have given the lineup a boost since their mid-June promotions from A-Adv. Bradenton. Glendinning ranks seventh in the league with 26 RBIs in 45 games since his June 13 promotion and currently leads all Pirates minor leaguers with a .301 batting average while ranking second with 101 hits and a .367 on-base percentage between the two levels. Since Sharpe's June 21 debut for the Curve, the outfielder has scored the third-most runs, 27, in the E.L. driven in 24 RBIs, fourth-most, and hit six homers, the sixth-best total in the league. Each player has also contributed a walk-off hit since joining the team.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve active roster features three of Baseball America's Top 30 Pirates prospects with infielder Oneil Cruz (No. 3), outfielder Jared Oliva (No. 19) and right-handed pitcher Cody Bolton (No. 21). Oliva is ranked by B.A. as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system while Cruz is regarded as the organization's "Best Power Hitter" and "Best Infield Arm". After the latest MLB.com Mid-Season update, four Top 30 Pirates prospects are in Altoona with Cruz (No. 3), Oliva (No. 11), Bolton (No. 13) and right-handed reliever Blake Cederlind (No. 29). Across all of baseball, Cruz is ranked by Baseball America as their No. 79 overall prospect and No. 12 shortstop while MLB.com rates the 20-year-old as the No. 62 prospect in baseball and their No. 9 prospect.

Ryan returns for his third season in Altoona after guiding the Curve to back-to-back Western Division championships. In his first season, the Curve captured the 2017 Eastern League title. He also managed the Western Division All-Stars in the 2018 Eastern League All-Star Classic. Ryan started his coaching career as a coach for the Curve in 2012. He is in his seventh season as a manager in the Pirates organization, leading the Bradenton Marauders from 2015-16 and the West Virginia Power from 2014-15. He steered Bradenton to a 70-66 record in 2016 and won the Florida State League championship. Ryan played 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors, after he was a fifth-round draft choice by the Minnesota Twins in 1996.

Hanrahan joins the Curve in 2019 for his third season as a pitching coach in the Pittsburgh minor league system. He started his coaching career with the Bristol Pirates in 2017 and most recently oversaw pitchers for the West Virginia Power last year. Hanrahan was a two-time National League All-Star with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2011 and 2012 while he served as the team's closer. He was the first Buccs closer to notch 40 saves in a single season and recorded 82 saves, fifth all-time, during four seasons in Pittsburgh. A second-round pick by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2000, he played 14 totals seasons and seven years as a right-handed reliever in the majors.

Nunnally comes to the Curve for his first year in the Pirates organization and 12th season as a coach in professional baseball. During the 2010-11 seasons, he was the hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians under manager Manny Acta. Nunnally spent the last two seasons as the Minor League Outfield and Baserunning Coordinator for the Los Angeles Angels. He has served as a hitting coach in the Indians, Toronto Blue Jays and Boston Red Sox developmental systems with Eastern League stops in New Hampshire (2012, 14) and Portland (2016). As a player, Nunnally was drafted by Cleveland in the third round in 1992 and played 15 seasons. He also played six major league seasons.

Paniagua joins the Curve for his third season as a coach in the Pirates organization. He started his coaching career in 2017 with the Bristol Pirates and was the hitting coach for the Dominican Summer League affiliate last year. He played for 13 years as an international signee out of the Dominican Republic. Paniagua spent parts of six seasons as a member of the Boston Red Sox and New York Mets minor league systems that included Eastern League experience with Portland (2007) and Binghamton (2008-09). He also spent six seasons (2011-16) with the independent York Revolution and is the longest-tenured position player in franchise history.

In his eighth season as a member of the Pittsburgh organization, Ahrens returns to Altoona for a third season in 2019. In 2018, Ahrens was the trainer for the Western Division for the Eastern League All-Star Classic. He spent two years in Bradenton from 2015-16, where he was named Florida State League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2016. He spent each the last six seasons on the same staff as manager Michael Ryan. Ahrens received a bachelor's degree in athletic training from Carroll University in 2011, and a master's degree in kinesiology from Fresno Pacific University in 2016.

Schlesinger returns to the Curve for his third season, after making stops at Jamestown, West Virginia and Bradenton within the Pittsburgh system. In 2018, Ahrens was the trainer for the Western Division for the Eastern League All-Star Classic. Prior to joining the Pirates, he served as the strength and conditioning graduate assistant at Duquesne University from 2012-2014. Schlesinger graduated from Toledo with a degree in exercise science in 2011 and completed his master's degree of science in sports leadership at Duquesne in 2014.
